this selective critical survey of organ literature from hofhaimer and paumann to the present day is a useful guide both for the organist seeking repertoire and for the listener looking for brief analyses of organ works encountered in recitals or on record it has been a standard work in germany for more than a generation appearing in five editions it is now translated into english for the first time organists in the english speaking countries will find the author s continental perspective of particular interest as he treats fully many significant composers hermann grabner willy burkhard günter raphael and joseph ahrens are only a few examples whose works are frequently performed in germany yet remain almost unknown in america and england this guide may therefore suggest a largely unexplored realm of music written for the classically oriented instrument that awaits the adventurous organist the chronological survey of composers treats all of the standard repertoire by familiar composers and includes as well some works by composers too little known johann ernst eberlin and bohuslav cernohorsky in the 18th century and gustav merkel in the 19th are examples this edition includes addenda on british and american organ music by the well known american organist lee garrett expanding the

scope of Lukas's work musical examples show principal themes of selected works and publishers are listed for each composer dust jacket

This is a completely revised 2003 edition of volumes I and II of the organ music of J.S. Bach. 1980 a bestselling title which has subsequently become a classic text. This edition takes account of Bach scholarship of the 25 years prior to publication. Peter Williams's piece by piece commentary puts the musical sources of the organ works in context, describing the form and content of each work and relating them to other music, German and non-German. He summarises the questions about the history, authenticity, chronology, function and performance of each piece and points out important details of style and musical quality. The study follows the order of the Bach Catalogue BWV, beginning with the sonatas, then the free works, followed by chorales and ending with the doubtful works including the newly discovered chorales of 1985.

Joseph Jongen was director of the Brussels Conservatoire from 1925 to 1939. He was first and foremost a composer and yet his career as an organist and composer of organ music was remarkable. His *Sonata ero ca* has become one of the enduring works of the repertory and the *Symphonie concertante* commissioned by Rodman Wanamaker for the organ of the Philadelphia store has been considered the finest of all twentieth century organ concertos. This is the first book ever to appear about Joseph Jongen in any language. It is based on twenty years of research by its author John Scott Whiteley. Part I traces Jongen's life and achievements as an organist from his earliest training in Franck's birthplace Liège to his exile in England and his final years in Brussels during which time he headed the team that designed the organ for Belgian Radio. Part II is a guide to the organ music from the points of view of both performer and musicologist. Appendices provide a catalogue of works, a numbering system for his works without opus numbers, specifications of the organs he played and lists of variant readings in his manuscripts. This book is indispensable for serious students of the organ, the romantic organ repertoire and European music of the early twentieth century.

The roots of the early organ tradition lay in the exuberant ritual of the medieval church and in particular in the Chapel Royal. The tradition grew and flourished in the golden age of the Renaissance in the hands of four composers: Byrd, Bull, Gibbons and Tomkins. During the 18th century it evolved into something new: the voluntary, reaching its apogee in the work of Samuel Wesley. The death of this great composer in 1837 marks not only the end of the organ tradition but also the end of an epoch in British music as a whole. For by this time the long years of musical sterility which marked Victorian England and which were destined to extend beyond the end of the century had begun. This book examines the evolution of the music written for the organ throughout the period and the technical aspects of the development of the instrument as they have a bearing on the work and style of the composers who wrote for it. It is summarized at the end of each chapter. It lists the complete extant repertoire together with biographical notes on the composers and the appendices include lists and descriptions of 126 manuscript sources, 212 printed editions and three select bibliographies.
