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with the international take up of new technology in the 1990s designers and typographers reassessed their roles and jettisoned existing rules in an explosion of creativity in graphic design this book tells that story in detail defining and illustrating key developments and themes from 1980 2000

an exploration of the parallel development of product and graphic design from the 18th century to the 21st the effects of mass production and consumption man made industrial materials and extended lines of communication are also discussed

this book explores the broad issue of postmodernism and tells the story of the movement that has changed the face of architecture over the last forty years in this completely rewritten edition of his seminal work charles jencks brings the history of architecture up to date and shows how demands for a new and complex architecture aided by computer

design have led to more convivial sensuous and articulate buildings around the world

postmodernism has become the buzzword of contemporary society yet it remains baffling in its variety of definitions contexts and associations beginning postmodernism aims to offer clear accessible and step by step introductions to postmodernism across a wide range of subjects it encourages readers to explore how the debates about postmodernism have emerged from basic philosophical and cultural ideas with its emphasis firmly on postmodernism in practice the book contains exercises and questions designed to help readers understand and reflect upon a variety of positions in the following areas of contemporary culture philosophy and cultural theory architecture and concepts of space visual art sculpture and the design arts popular culture and music film video and television culture and the social sciences

crafting design in italy is the first book to examine the role that craft played in the history of post war italian design one the most celebrated episodes in twentieth century design craft was vital to the development of design in italy from 1945 to the 1980s and yet as often as this story has been told it is incomplete missing is the overlooked but multiple role that craft played as a method of manufacture set of disciplines and traditions materials and ideas this book examines the multiple ways that craft shaped italian design from 1945 to 1981 it is organised in four chapters each of which focus the different ways that italy s architects engaged with craft in the context of the bigger socio economic cultural and political changes of the period from the imperatives of post war reconstruction to the explosion in luxury in the economic miracle of the 1960s to the experimentation of radical design and the postmodern adventures of studio alchimia and memphis it uses a series of case studies on design areas including product furniture fashion glass and ceramics to bring to light previously unknown makers and objects as well as re examine design icons such as gio ponti s superleggera chair and ettore sottsass s carlton bookcase this project uses the concept of craft to offer a radical re reading of post war italian design it also sets out to provide a paradigm for using craft based approaches and analysing design and craft s relationship in other cultures and contexts

a comprehensive and authoritative publication on one of the most popular periods of international design including architecture furniture ceramics applied arts graphics and textiles originating as a rebellious movement in philosophy and literature postmodernism proclaimed the death of modernism and promoted a new nonlinear way of approaching architecture and design spearheaded by michael graves robert venturi ettore sottsass and alessandro mendini it became a style in itself and the defining look of the 1980s postmodern design complete is the comprehensive reference to this period of vibrant design as it profiles key creators including graves mendini sottsass venturi charles jencks and denise scott brown and covers the fields of architecture furniture graphic design textiles and product and industrial design a section on living with postmodernism presents fifteen seminal homes and their furnishings and a final section titled postmodernism continues is a comprehensive overview of contemporary makers highly informed and

accessible texts are illustrated by more than 1 000 images that bring together classics and little seen rarities unusual objets d art and mass produced items this definitive volume also includes a foreword by charles jencks and an afterword by denise scott brown followed by a substantial reference section

what is post modernism is it a new world view or an outgrowth of the post industrial society is it a shift in philosophy the arts and architecture in this fourth entirely revised edition charles jencks one of the founders of the post modern movement shows it is all these things plus many other forces that have exploded since the early 1960s in a unique analysis using diagrams designed especially for this edition he reveals the evolutionary social and economic forces of this new stage of global civilisation but why has post modern culture arrived in an ironic parable the protestant crusade jencks uncovers some hitherto hidden origins the modernists abhorrence for all things sensuous and natural and their zeal for all things orderly and mechanistic this pseudo religion led in the 1920s to the famous vacuum cleaning period the purgation of values metaphysics and emotion in the 1970s it led on to the protestant inquisition which inadvertently created the very enemy modernists feared post modernism a counter reformation the reassertion of worldliness fecundity humour and pluralism however more than one tradition emerged and jencks distinguishing two types of post modernism deconstructive and reconstructive demonstrates that the former is often a disguised form of late modernism this takes the de creation and nihilism of its parent to extremes the main engine that drives global culture today post modernisation the electronic economy and instant communications network is analysed in its close relation to other posts post fordism post socialism and the post national world of trading blocs and unstable nations jencks argues that this may result in catastrophe and global governance or a web of transnational institutions and obligations the most radical idea of this challenging book is the conclusion the notion that the post modern world does not mean the end of metanarratives but something quite different belief systems are flourishing as never before and jencks argues a new metanarrative based on the story of the universe and its generative qualities will soon create a new world view that will affect all areas it is a story which grows directly out of the post modern sciences of complexity and is thus both true and mythic other what is titles include what is abstraction what is deconstruction

in the story of post modernism charles jencks the authority on post modern architecture and culture provides the defining account of post modern architecture from its earliest roots in the early 60s to the present day by breaking the narrative into seven distinct chapters which are both chronological and overlapping jencks charts the ebb and flow of the movement the peaks and troughs of different ideas and themes the book is highly visual as well as providing a chronological account of the movement each chapter also has a special feature on the major works of a given period the first up to date narrative of post modern architecture other major books on the subject were written 20 years ago an accessible narrative that will appeal to students who are new to the subject as well as

those who can remember its heyday in the 70s and 80s

garish churches gabled panel blocks neo historical tenements this book is about these and other architectural oddities that emerged in poland between 1975 and 1989 a period characterised by the decline of the authoritarian socialist regime and waves of political protest during that period committed architects defied repressive politics and persistent shortages and designed houses and churches which adapted eclectic historical forms and geometric volumes and were based on traditional typologies these buildings show a very different background of postmodernism far removed from the debates over robert venturi philip johnson or prince charles in western europe and north america a context in which postmodern architecture stood not for world weary irony in an economically saturated society but for individualised counter propositions to a collectivist ideology for a yearning for truth and spiritual values and for a discourse on distinctiveness and national identity postmodern architecture in socialist poland argues that this new architecture marked the beginning of socio political transformation and at the same time showed postmodernism s reconciliatory potential in light of massive historical ruptures and wartime destruction these buildings successfully responded to the contradictory desires for historical continuity and acknowledgment of rupture and loss next to international ideas the architects took up domestic traditions such as the ideas of the polish school of historic conservation and long standing national patriotic narratives they thus contributed to the creation of a built environment and intellectual climate that have been influential to date this book will be of great interest to students and scholars interested in postmodern architecture and urban design as well as in the socio cultural background and transformative potential of architecture under socialism
